Project Description Summary:

The Chamblee Dunwoody Road corridor improvements will relieve congestion, improve safety and provide multi-modal transportation options along a major north-south connection to I-285. The corridor currently is predominantly a two lane facility that carries over 15,000 vehicles per day. In addition to providing access to I-285 the corridor connects to other roads on ARC's Regional Strategic Transportation System (RSTS) including Spalding Drive and Mount Vernon Road. The intersections at Mount Vernon and at North Shallowford/Peeler Road operate at a unacceptable level of service. Currently there are no facilities for bikes and frequent gaps in the sidewalk network.

The Chamblee Dunwoody Road corridor improvements will consist of improvements at the Mount Vernon Road and North Shallowford/Peeler intersections. Additionally, on-street bike lanes will be added for the full length of the corridor and continuous sidewalks will be provided on both sides of the road. The project is located within the City of Dunwoody beginning at I-285 and continuing north to Spalding Drive.
