Departmental Highlights

Community Development

- Completed substantial portion of the Zoning Code Rewrite
- Created a new "Planned Development" zoning district
- Completed twelve multi-family apartment complex lawsuits, identifying over 8,000 safety issues for repair
- Updated rules and procedures for all planning and zoning processes and application amendments for clarity
- Developed and adopted an Urban Canopy Tree Inventory & Assessment for the care and maintenance of our trees
- Completed and implemented GIS Web Browser for public viewing of GIS information
- Silver Certification as an Atlanta Regional Commission Green Community

Public Works

- Resurfaced over 14 lane miles of roadway based on the priorities set by the 2009 Pavement Conditions Analysis
- Added bike lanes on Perimeter Center East and Mount Vernon west of Ashford Dunwoody
- Completed final design for Tilly Mill - North Peachtree Road intersection
- Presented conceptual design for Womack - Vermaak intersection
- Added new sidewalks on Happy Hollow Road and Valley View Road and began construction at 10 other locations as prioritized in the City's Sidewalk Improvement Program
- Secured \$640,000 in funding from the Atlanta Regional Commission for sidewalks, bicycle improvements, and paving on Chamblee Dunwoody Road between Cambridge Ave and Valley View Road
- Received a \$3,000,000 grant from GDOT for a three year term to optimize and actively manage traffic signals in Perimeter Mall area
- Received support from GDOT to update signal timing on Lemon Road, Tilly Mill Road, North Shallowford Chamblee Dunwoody Road
- Implemented new work order management system with the new interface SeeClickFix as well as the City's Information System (GIS)
- Completed stormwater pipe replacement projects

- Completed Agreements with Recreation Partners to relocate the fountain at Brook Run Park
- Completed Brook Run Trail Phase I
- Completed work from the DMR Recreational Run Trail Phase II
- Completed "Pic in the Park," a City Day

Police Department

- Implemented Car-Fit program for senior citizens for proper and safe seating of seniors for vehicle operation

- Participated in aggressive targeting of "pill mills" through coordination of efforts with the DEA and other agencies
- Implemented a Medifarm Drug Collection Unit so citizens can bring unused or unneeded prescription medications to the Department for safe disposal
- Targeted criminal offenders by making 1,619 arrests and issued 6,686 citations

2012 Signature Initiatives

In addition to the department accomplishments, several citywide initiatives highlight the year.

Project Renaissance - A New Georgetown

In March, the City unveiled Project Renaissance - A New Georgetown. This revitalization effort implements the 35-acre development vision for Georgetown by activating the property in a multi-year exclusive lease (a 10-acre parcel for the interim parking structure) in May 2012. The City announced the plan for the redevelopment of the site, which will be utilizing existing parking structure and creating a new parking structure and residential 13 acres of land for low-density housing. In September, the City hosted with a contractor construction plans and issued the property to state for construction will begin in early 2013.

Brook Run Park - Multi-Use Trail Grant

In 2012, the City was awarded a second \$100,000 from the Department of Natural Resources Recreational Trails Program to fund the creation of a 17-mile permanent loop multi-use trail in Brook Run Park. With trail being supported from more than \$100,000 in private donations, the City has received more than \$100,000 in private donations to create the trail. 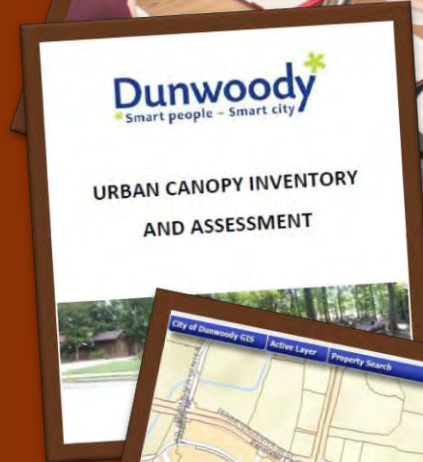
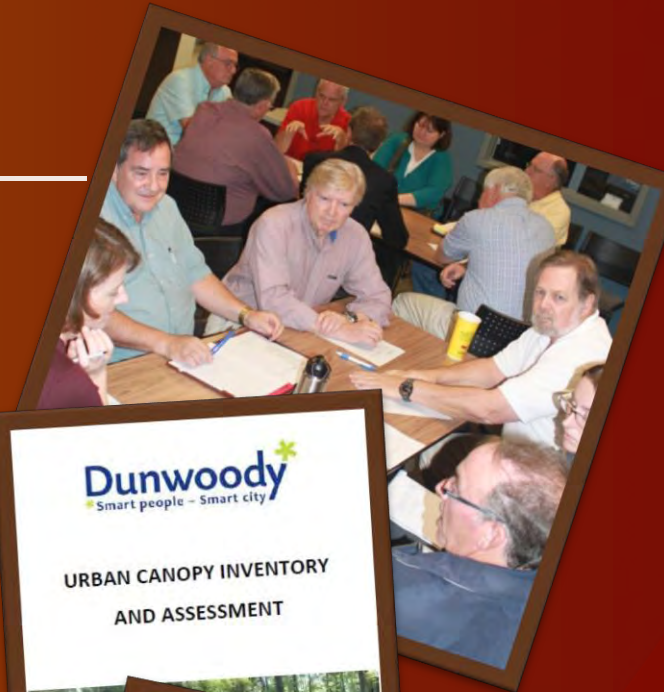
Training
