

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

In 2005, Congress created a national Safe Routes to School (SRTS) program designed to enable and encourage school-aged children grades K-8, including those with disabilities, to walk or bike to school safely.

Administered by the Georgia Department of Transportation (GDOT), Georgia's SRTS non-infrastructure funds help to educate, encourage, and evaluate school participation in Safe Routes' programs. The Safe Routes Resource Center has partnered with educators across Georgia to carry out programs in schools and communities that once again make walking and bicycling to school a safe and routine activity for school-aged children. In 2009, GDOT awarded a contract to URS Corporation in Atlanta, to develop and manage the SRTS Resource Center. With a team of six school outreach coordinators, the team is reaching tens of thousands of students and their families. More than 400 elementary and secondary schools and 170 stakeholder "Friends" are working with the Resource Center, to offer programs and activities at their schools that support Safe Routes objectives.

PEDESTRIAN SAFETY EDUCATION CURRICULUM:

The Georgia SRTS Resource Center provided six Pedestrian Safety Education Training sessions across the state in the fall of 2011. Using a "train-the-trainer" format, participants experienced an interactive, handson training session, learning tips to teaching a national child pedestrian safety curriculum for Georgia's K-5 students. The training introduced a newly-released pedestrian safety curriculum developed by the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) and adapted for Georgia's schools by the Resource Center.

NATIONAL COURSE WORKSHOPS:

Each Resource Center team member is trained to teach the SRTS National Course. This course was developed by various national bicycle and pedestrian advocates and provides participants with an in-depth study of SRTS's comprehensive approach to safety, health, air quality, and community building. A walk audit is performed at the host school, and attendees from varied professional and personal backgrounds are guided through hands-on activities that assess the barriers to and options for creating safe routes to school.

TRAVEL PLAN ASSISTANCE:

Travel Planning assistance is provided to select schools throughout Georgia that demonstrate a need and desire for short and long-term Safe Routes to School strategies, through an organized plan that is backed by research, community involvement, and support. The Resource Center staff, including outreach, planners, designers, and management, have worked with local community teams to develop 14 School Travel Plans.

GUIDE AND WORKBOOK:

The Resource Center developed the GA SRTS Guide and Workbook. These valuable resources are available in print or in electronic format and aid schools and community organizations in developing goals, utilizing proven strategies, finding funding for improvements and efforts, and sustaining Safe Routes programs in their own communities.





KEY ACHIEVEMENTS

Securing school partners in every Congressional District, and throughout 72 School Districts across Georgia

Completing 14 comprehensive Travel Plans for schools and their communities to carry out and sustain local Safe Routes initiatives. Each travel plan resulted from the active commitment and involvement of principals, engaged parents, neighborhood leaders, and community health and safety officials, supported by Resource Center staff.

Offering Pedestrian Safety Training for elementary schools, following the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration's (NHTSA) Curriculum. More than 100 educators participated in the Resource Center's workshops, and many others have requested and continue to request training materials.

Recruiting tens of thousands of school-children at more than 120 schools across Georgia to participate in International Walk to School Day (iWalk) each October. Launching Georgia Walk to School Day, or 'gWalk,' –with hundreds of events being held at schools in the last three year.



TWENTY-THREE SCHOOLS

in the Savannah Chatham County public school system have become Partners of the Resource Center, along with many Friends of the Resource Center, including Healthy Savannah, the City of Savannah, Safe Kids Savannah, and the Savannah Bicycle Campaign.

NEWBERN MIDDLE, a Gold-level Partner in the City of Valdosta, was awarded \$279,769 for infrastructure improvements. Their Safe Routes program includes participation in IWalk/Gwalk, ongoing student education, extensive parent participation, and SRTS activities in all physical education classes. SRTS is also a major component of a community-wide effort to build a tranquility trail as a safe walking route for students and community members.



ON INTERNATIONAL WALK-TO-SCHOOL DAY

2010, Clay County's elementary and middle school students participated in their first Walk-to-School Day event. The event was the culmination of collaborative efforts by the Resource Center staff, River Valley Regional Commission, the Schools, Health Department, Police Department, and the City of Fort Gaines City Manager. The Police Department escorted hundreds of students, teachers, staff, parents, and volunteers through the streets of Fort Gaines to the shared Middle/Elementary school campus, where the younger students joined in for a Pedestrian Safety and Health assembly.

IN A RURAL AREA WITH NO SIDEWALKS

connecting the school to the main street area, the Chattahoochee County Education Center has taken great strides to ensure that students receive pedestrian safety education during their physical education classes, through the NHTSA Child Pedestrian Safety Education Curriculum. The school also initiated an afterschool walking club, led by the Principal.

IN JUNE 2011, THE CITY OF ROBERTA'S

Crawford County Elementary and Middle School and Crawford County Eagle's Nest School were awarded \$358,530 to enhance walking and bicycling opportunities for their students. Each school participates in Walk to School Days; has conducted student and parent surveys; and sends its school champions to the Resource Center's Pedestrian Safety Education workshops. Each participates in the Safe Routes to School program by holding 'walk at school' events and by incorporating Safe Routes to School lessons into the classroom. Students benefit from this being a core component of their curriculum.






COWAN ROAD ELEMENTARY

was one of only six schools statewide chosen by a panel of judges as an Outstanding School Partner in 2011. Cowan Road started its Walk to School program with only four people and has since expanded it to include the entire community. Forging their Partnership with the Georgia Safe Routes to School Resource Center resulted in an expansion of the efforts; over the past two years, more and more parents have formed 'walking school buses' in an initiative that now boasts more than 70 individuals walking to school daily.

HENRY COUNTY SCHOOLS

was the first school district in its entirety to Partner with the Resource Center. Forty-one elementary and middle schools into Partnership with the program and eight high schools became Friends of the Resource Center. Six of the 41 partner schools applied for and were awarded \$445,425 in infrastructure funding to construct or install sidewalks, crosswalks, cross-walk striping, flashing lights, school-zone signage, bike racks, and speed bumps – all of which will make conditions safer for children to walk and bicycle to school.

THE NATIONAL CENTER

for Safe Routes to School awarded one of its coveted \$1000 mini-grants to Evansdale Elementary in Dekalb County in Fall 2011. This Silver-level partner is a neighborhood school with 500 students. Approximately 12 percent of Evansdale's students walk to school daily. The mini-grant will fund additional encouragement activities and safety projects, including expanding their Walk and Roll Wednesday campaign; implementing student-designed, semi-permanent safety signage to encourage driver awareness of pedestrians and cyclists; and piloting innovative pedestrian safety measure at a dangerous intersection with poor visibility.

THE RESOURCE CENTER

partnered with DeKalb County's Boards of Health and Education to identify nine Dekalb County Partner schools for receipt of a \$5,000 Strategic Alliance for Health Grant to initiate and implement SRTS programs as part of a School District-wide health and wellness initiative. Safe Routes to School was identified as a key component of the daily physical activity and environmental health tenets of the program.

THE SCHOOLS IN THE CITY OF DECATUR

continue to build strong Safe Routes programs. Each school hosts monthly walk-to-school day events, and with support from Decatur Active Living, the City of Decatur, parent champions, school staff, and volunteers, the schools boast well over 1,000 walk and bike participants during International Walk-to-School Day.



PRIOR TO 2010, THE LOVETT SCHOOL

(a private school in Atlanta) had a strict "no walking or biking" policy. This policy was removed to support Lovett's sustainability and alternative transportation efforts. Partnership with the Resource Center resulted in the school's first ever Walk-to-School Day in December 2010. More than 300 students walked, biked, scooted, or skated to school. Successive walks have shown an increase in walkers from 250 to more than 400 participants. The Lovett School now hosts four official walk-to-school day events each year, with plans to increase this number.

THE CITY OF DECATUR

and the Decatur School District are excellent examples of sustained Safe Routes to School efforts, supporting walking and bicycling families, and encouraging safety. Clairemont Elementary produced a video for Georgia Walk to School Day in 2011, that has been viewed across the country and internationally and is one of many instructional and inspirational videos accessible through the Resource Center website.

AT TORAH DAY

a traditional Jewish community school in Atlanta, many children walk daily. Recognizing a need for increased pedestrian safety education, the Resource Center has provided a number of services to support the school, including a walk-audit assessment, incentives for safety, and curriculum support.

THE CITY OF DUNWOODY

has included Safe Routes to School Partnership as a component of its efforts to become a "bicycle friendly" city, in addition to adopting a Complete Streets policy. With substantial community support, the Dunwoody schools are exceeding requirements for Silver and Gold level Safe Routes partnership. On Georgia Walk-to-School Day 2012, the Dunwoody Schools competed for the Resource Center's Golden Shoe Award. The award was presented to Kingsley Charter Elementary school for having the highest percentage of walkers (97% of students walked to school). Austin Elementary School followed closely with 92% walkers during the event.

GOLD LEVEL PARTNER,

East Side Elementary, received a \$1,000 mini-grant from the National Center for Safe Routes to School in Fall 2011 to implement the East Side Walking/Biking School Bus program. The program will equip each parent with a reflective backpack, safety vest, Stop/Slow street sign, first aid kit, whistle, and flashlight with which to lead their Walking/Biking School Bus. Each student will be given a pedometer that records the number of steps they take each day to remind them about the importance of taking "each step" toward improved health.

CRABAPPLE CROSSING ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

was awarded the Outstanding Partner of the year for 2010-11 in recognition of their efforts to increase the number of students walking and biking safely to school. This Silver-level partner school has grown from a non-walking school just three years ago, to completing nine monthly walk-to-school events this year, averaging 120 student participants. More than 300 students participated in Georgia Walk-to-School Day and all 740 students participated in a school-wide Bicycle rodeo in March.

WHEN ARCADO ELEMENTARY in Gwinnett County first

launched its Safe Routes to Schools program in 2009, the school had never hosted a Walk to School Day event or incorporated pedestrian safety education into the school curriculum. With assistance from the SRTS Resource Center staff, the school hosted the first of many Walk to School Day events and held a school-wide assembly to teach students the basics of pedestrian safety. Arcado, now a Gold-level Partner, regularly celebrates walking and biking to school with Walking Wednesdays, using the Resource Center's punch-cards for their Frequent Walker



IN THE FALL OF 2009,

the Resource Center staff met with a group of determined city leaders at the Dublin City Hall to discuss their Safe Routes efforts. The result was a comprehensive School Travel Plan developed for Susie Dasher Elementary that prioritized bicycle and pedestrian infrastructure around the school and nearby Saxon Heights Elementary. In 2010, the district applied for and was awarded infrastructure funding for an extensive sidewalk project along Martin Luther King Boulevard that will connect new developments to the schools, enabling more than 100 students to walk and bike to school along an otherwise dangerous stretch of highway. The project is scheduled to be let in June 2014.



Resource Center during the 2011-2012 school year. The school formed a SRTS taskforce committed to implementing the engineering and non-engineering recommendations of their School Travel Plan, to create a bike and pedestrian friendly community around the school. Among the first projects to be implemented are new school-zone signage and the installation of crosswalks, sidewalks, and speed-bumps. Gray Elementary is also working to implement many of its non-infrastructure Plan components, including expanding students' participation in 'walk and talk lunches,' Walk across America, and using pedometers to calculate their daily mileage.



ALL OF THE ELEMENTARY SCHOOLS

in Dalton City are Partnered with the Resource Center and were recently awarded infrastructure funding to carry out projects to enhance walking and bicycling to school. At the beginning of the 2010-2011 school year, the local district cut bus routes within a mile and a half of all schools, saving almost \$1M in transportation costs. Several schools went from having almost no walkers to seeing more than 200 children walk on a daily basis. The Resource Center worked with the schools to help prepare students and parents for this change, by providing pedestrian safety information, conducting walk audits, and helping plan Walk to School Days.

MASHBURN ELEMENTARY

in Forsyth County has one of the most successful "Park and Walk" programs in the state. On select days, parents park their cars at a nearby grocery store and walk with their students that last mile to school. On the days that the Park and Walk events take place, morning traffic – which is mostly directly related to school trips – is significantly reduced. Informal counts during Walk to School Days show up to a 70% reduction in vehicle traffic.



LEWISTON ELEMENTARY


is an infrastructure awardee and a Gold Partner of the Resource Center. Every year, the school eagerly participates in International Walk to School Day and Georgia Walk to School Day with a community walk and educational assemblies that include the Columbia County Sheriff's office. Program champions are the physical education teachers at Lewiston, who distribute incentives, utilize pedometers, and organize the events.

CORNELIA ELEMENTARY

in rural Habersham county, has been a true example of how the Safe Routes to School program can work for Rural Communities. When Cornelia Elementary hosted its first Walk to School Day event in 2009, there were fewer than 30 students participating. Two years later, participation has jumped to 150 students taking part regularly in walking events. Because of the school leadership's strong commitment to growing a sustainable program, Cornelia was awarded an infrastructure grant in 2011 to improve walking and biking conditions around the school. GDOT and Habersham County Engineers have held the initial concept meeting with the school and will be moving forward to carry out the infrastructure plan during the 2012-2013 school year.

TIMOTHY ROAD ELEMENTARY

was Northeast Georgia's School of the Year for the 2010-2011 school year. As a Gold level partner, the school hosts regular monthly walk to school day events and has an almost daily Park and Walk program. The Resource Center staff has helped the school leadership integrate Safe Routes concepts into the culture of the school; it continues to be a top priority for the PTA and School Administration.

CHEATHAM HILL ELEMENTARY

in Cobb County was recently awarded an infrastructure grant to connect sidewalks and improve safety conditions for walking and bicycling students from nearby neighborhoods. For the past three years, Cheatham Hill has held increasingly successful Walk to School events with up to half of the school's 1,200 students participating. During a typical Walk to School Day, several police cars with flashing lights are parked along John Ward Road to increase driver-awareness of all the walkers. Upon arrival to the school, students are greeted with a healthy snack and incentive items.

KINCAID ELEMENTARY,

a Gold-level partner in Cobb County, was the Northwest Georgia Outstanding School Partner of the Year for 2010-2011. The school has a very successful year-round Walk on Wednesday (WOW) program. As part of the program, students are awarded beads every time they participate and are encouraged to bring friends to participate. Their Safe Routes program is supported by the PTA and is incorporated into the school's reward system, in which students who walk to school become eligible for weekly prize drawings. Kincaid hosted the Pedestrian Safety Education Training for Northwest Georgia in October 2011 and served as the host site for Georgia Walk to School Day in March 2012.



OAK HILL MIDDLE IN BALDWIN COUNTY

had more than 1,200 students participate in its 2nd annual International Walk At School Day in October 2011. Parents, staff volunteers, and members of Live Healthy Baldwin also joined the event. To kick off the event, students participated in a Safe Routes to School assembly, during which the SRTS school coordinator gave a welcoming statement and one student from each grade delivered a three-minute speech entitled, "Why it is important to Walk to School and be Physically Active." Students, staff volunteers, parents, and Live Healthy Baldwin representatives then walked 1.5 miles around the campus, during which students also collected litter to clean-up their campus. Each student participant was presented with a wrist-band from the Safe Routes to School Resource center.

WEST CHATHAM ELEMENTARY,

a Gold level partner in the Savannah Chatham County School District, was the Coastal Region's 2011 Outstanding Partner of the Year. The school boasts a significant number of students who walk or cycle to school, each year, breaking its own participation record during International and Georgia Walk to School Days. During the 2011 event, more than 800 children, parents, and volunteers walked to school! During the March 2012 Georgia Walk to school Day, nearly every student at the school was able to walk to or at school. Park and walk sites were established, walking school buses were organized, and morning-care students marched around the campus, while bused students were dropped off at the middle-school next door and walked to West Chatham from there.

LOUISVILLE ACADEMY

in Jefferson County was one of the state's first Safe Routes infrastructure project awardees. Located in the heart of Louisville near a major state highway, the school will be rebuilt in the coming year , to coincide with plans for nearly \$500,000 in sidewalks, signage, and access improvements to be let in July 2012. The concept meeting for these infrastructure projects held in 2011 had a direct influence on the orientation of the new school facility. Prior to the concept meeting, pedestrian and bicycle access from neighborhoods around the school had not been considered in the orientation of the new building façade. After considering the safety issues and accessibility for all students, stakeholders at the Safe Routes meetings decided to orient the school toward the neighborhood.

has a dynamic staff champion, their art teacher. In addition to incorporating SRTS into the 4th grade health and obesity program sponsored by Southern Regional Hospital, Callaway's champion is working with the Resource Center to develop a neighborhood watch program, start walking school busses for current walkers, host a health and safety fair leading up to iwalk, and hold wellattended annual International Walk to School Days. Currently 50 of the 800 Callaway students walk to school regularly, however there is great potential to increase this number if additional safety measures are implemented.
