- WHEREAS, In its 45<sup>th</sup> year, Chesnut's Parent Teacher Council published its three guiding principles: (1) Identify and institute creative approaches to learning; (2) welcome parent involvement; and (3) celebrate our diverse school family; and
- *WHEREAS,* In its 45<sup>th</sup> year, Chesnut's media center and faculty lounge were renovated with \$12,000 in fundraising dollars and with contributions from within the community; and
- *WHEREAS,* Chesnut was recently awarded a \$5000 grant from Governor Nathan Deal's Student Health and Physical Education (SHAPE) initiative; and
- *WHEREAS,* Chesnut Charter has an organic gardening program and an outdoor classroom for farm-to-school lesson plans which incorporate the garden into multidisciplinary, standards-based curriculum; and
- *WHEREAS* Chesnut Charter currently funds and provides its students online math and reading programs to supplement the county curriculum; and
