A RESOLUTION BY THE CITY OF DUNWOODY, GEORGIA TO COLLABORATE WITH THE PERIMETER COMMUNITY IMPROVEMENT DISTRICTS (PCIDS) AND THE CITIES OF BROOKHAVEN AND SANDY SPRINGS (PERIMETER CITIES) FOR LONG-TERM ECONOMIC SUSTAINABILITY OF THE PERIMETER MARKET

- **WHEREAS**, the Perimeter Community Improvement Districts (PCIDs) is a self-taxing district located partly in Fulton and partly in DeKalb Counties, including the Cities of Brookhaven, Dunwoody and Sandy Springs (Perimeter Cities); and
- **WHEREAS**, PCIDs charter, created through Georgia State Legislation, specifically defines that the organization is an independent entity created to serve the transportation infrastructure needs of the business property owners within its boundaries; and
- **WHEREAS**, PCIDs business property owners self-impose additional property tax dollars to improve the communities within its district, by accelerating transportation and infrastructure improvement programs and projects; and identifying and executing quality of life projects; and
- **WHEREAS**, PCIDs will continue to focus on transportation connectivity and quality of life for the business community and residents in the Perimeter Center area; and
- whereas, each of the Perimeter Cities is committed to long-term economic sustainability in their separate communities and in the Perimeter Market as a whole by utilizing resources wisely and in a manner that meets the needs of the business community and residents today and in the future; and
- WHEREAS, to advance the goals of ensuring long-term economic sustainability, a high quality of life, and the ability to provide and sustain adequate infrastructure for future development in the Perimeter Market, the Perimeter Cities desire to work with each other and with the PCID on programs and projects which focus on transportation infrastructure and quality of life amenities;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of Dunwoody, Georgia that the City of Dunwoody hereby supports and authorizes a collaboration with the PCIDs and the Perimeter Cities on programs and projects to benefit the long-term sustainability of the Perimeter Market and authorizes the City Manager to take any and all actions necessary to effectuate the purpose and intent of this resolution.
