


This is an important year for parks in the City of Dunwoody as we move forward with transformational improvement plans at Brook Run Park. We are also celebrating 10 years as a city with about 30 more acres of park space than when we started.

Parks are a priority in Dunwoody, which is home to more than 180 acres of green space in seven city parks. We remain committed to meeting the needs of active and passive park participants.

Dunwoody residents and visitors of all ages can enjoy a variety of activities in our parks. As you'll discover in this guide, our parks include dedicated areas for skating, bocce, baseball, tennis, basketball, and more. We also have miles of trails for walking,

running, biking and hiking. In fact, we're building more connections along the Dunwoody Trailway in 2019 to make it more accessible and enjoyable.

In late March, we'll begin a major construction project at Brook Run Park to add a great lawn with a performance stage, two multi-sports fields, a new covered picnic pavilion area and a nine-hole disc golf course. This project is the result of an enormous amount of public input and two park master plans. We invite you to experience something new at each one of our city's parks. Please know that we're working hard to




Arbor Day is a day set aside for schools, civic clubs, and other organizations, as well as individuals, to reflect on




Ways to Celebrate Earth Day:







City of Dunwoody Parks

1. Brook Run Park

Located at 4770 North Peachtree Road, at 110-acres, Brook Run Park is the largest park in not only Dunwoody but the region. This signature park features includes a large children's playground, 2-mile loop multiuse trail, skate park, dog park, community garden, and event pavilions. Dunwoody Senior Baseball is now proud to call Brook Run Park home. Parking for the baseball fields is located at Peachtree Charter Middle School at 4664 N. Peachtree Road, Dunwoody, Georgia 30338.

2. Pernoshal Park

Located at 4575 North Shallowford Road. at 5-acres, the Park at Pernoshal Court includes a pavilion, bathrooms, basketball courts, a pickleball court, large open field area for play, and a connection to part of the Dunwoody Trailway.

3. Dunwoody Park & Nature Center

Located at 5343 Roberts Drive, at 25-acres. Dunwoody Park includes a significant nature preserve with hiking trails, Wildcat Creek, a playground in the woods, and nature classrooms in the Dunwoody Nature Center.

4. North DeKalb Cultural Arts Center

Located at 5339 Chamblee Dunwoody Road, the North DeKalb Cultural Arts Center 6-acre property is a multi-arts complex conjoined to the Dunwoody Library. The North DeKalb Cultural Arts Center offers programs and classes for art enthusiasts of all ages looking to explore the incredible world of the arts. The Spruill Center for the Arts, Stage Door Players, and the Chattahoochee Handweavers Guild are all proud to call the North DeKalb Cultural Arts Center home.

5. Donaldson-Bannister Farm

Located at 4831 Chamblee Dunwoody Road. this historic home, built in the 1870's, and 5-acre property is open to the public and available to view and enjoy by contacting the Dunwoody Preservation Trust. The grounds are open daily for picnics, strolls, and free play in the open lawn. The historic home is available for special events and tours by appointment.

6. Windwood Hollow Park

Located at 4865 Lakeside Drive, at 11-acres, Windwood Hollow Park features a playground. two tennis courts, picnic pavilion, nature trails, and an open meadow for free play.

7. Georgetown Park

Located at 4400 Dunwoody Park Drive, at 3-acres, Georgetown Park is just the right size for a signature playground connected by a multi-use trail to a central square area complete with a grand gazebo, bocce courts, and decorative artisan fountain.

8. Vernon Oaks Park

Located at the corner of Vernon Springs Drive and Vernon Oaks Drive, this park is tucked into a tree lined Dunwoody neighborhood. This pocket park features a walking trail, seating, and a stone spring house.

9. Future Home of Park at Perimeter Center East

In June of 2017 the city completed its Parks & Recreation Master Plan from which this park concept was developed. Located at 50 Perimeter Center East this 5-acre park will have a trail connection from Georgetown Park and community to the Perimeter Area.

Size: 110 acres

Brook Run Park is the largest park in not only Dunwoody but the region. This signature park features includes a large children's playground, 2-mile loop multi-use trail, baseball fields, skate park, dog park, community garden, and event pavilions. The baseball fields are available for use for pick-up games outside of the scheduled school and baseball activities. Starting August 1, 2018, the fields will be closed every other Wednesday for maintenance. Parking for the baseball fields is located at Peachtree Charter Middle School at 4664 N. Peachtree Road, Dunwoody.



Brook Run Park is the largest park in not only Dunwoody but the region and is home to one of Dunwoody's largest playgrounds. At Brook Run children can slide, swing, run, jump and play!



Brook Run Park offers a two-mile multi-use trail that loops around the park. The trail is part of the 'Dunwoody Trailway' which is a multi-use trail connection winding through Brook Run Park across a tributary of Nancy Creek to connect to the Park at Pernoshal Court, and north to Georgetown Park.



Brook Run Skate Park is the largest skate park in the metro Atlanta area, consisting of a 27,000 sq. ft. "flow" type fully lit facility. The park was designed to accommodate entry-level skaters as well as challenge more advanced 'street skaters.' Helmets are required at the Skate Park so please come prepared. Download the Skate Park Rules.



Dunwoody Community Garden at Brook Run Park is more than a place to grow organic food: it is a place to cultivate community. Run by the 501(c)(3) Dunwoody Community Garden at Brook Run Park, approximately twenty percent of the produce is donated to charity. All members of the community, not just green thumbs, are encouraged to visit and see what's sprouting at the garden.



The City of Dunwoody is very excited to open this new amenity at Brook Run Park. The two new baseball fields were designed with Dunwoody Senior Baseball and Peachtree Charter Middle School to provide a variety of sports opportunities for our baseball league and the middle school physical education classes. The artificial turf maximizes the playtime available and has a multi-sport overlay for base-ball, softball and soccer.



The Brook Run Dog Park is roughly two wooded acres for off-leash play. The dog park is nestled in the woods towards the back of Brook Run Park, with tree canopies offering shade protection from the summer heat as well as from mild rains. The Dog Park is entirely fenced and features multiple entry points with doublegates for safety of the dogs and their humans.



The new elevated course and zip-line adventure showcases 52 obstacles and 12 zip-lines in 4 courses. In addition, the park includes a net trampoline, the first of its kind in Georgia, and a low ropes course for children ages 4 to 6, called Kiddie Quest. The park also includes picnic tables and birthday party areas. Learn more at www.TreetopQuest.com.

The park has a terraced lawn which is great for viewing events such as an outdoor 'Movie in the Meadow' or a summer concert. One may enter the park from the corner of North Shallowford and Pernoshal Court through a brick paved entry with steps leading down to the meadow area.

Pernoshal Park has two half-courts and a full size basketball court perfect for fun and exercise.



One of the half-courts has a Pickleball overlay which allows for Pickleball play, a paddle sport created for all ages and skill levels.



The park has stationary fitness equipment lining the trail on the top end of the park.



On the eastern side of the park is a large multipurpose sports open field area perfect for catch, frisbee, soccer or outdoor fun.



The park is connected to Brook Run Park and Georgetown Park through the Dunwoody Trailway system.

Georgetown Park

Address: 4400 Dunwoody Park Drive, Dunwoody

Size: 3 acres

The two primary features of Georgetown Park include a 1.4 acre central square and a 1.9 acre park with a signature children's playground and bocce. Georgetown Park is the current trailhead to the Dunwoody Trailway which is a continuation of the trail from Brook Run Park through Pernoshal Park leading to Georgetown Park and community into the Perimeter Area.






Address: 5127 Vernon Springs Drive, Dunwoody


Size: .5 acres

Located at the corner of Vernon Springs Drive and Vernon Oaks Drive, next door to 5127 Vernon Springs Drive, at .5-acre, Vernon Oaks Park is a hidden gem tucked into a tree lined Dunwoody neighborhood. This pocket park features a walking trail, seating, and a stone spring house.

Vernon Oaks Park is a unique pocket park, featuring an original spring house built by early area settlers. The park offers a quiet and serene setting for visitors and residents to read, sit, and relax.







Dunwoody Park is a 35-acre park facility home to a significant nature preserve around Wildcat Creek, complete with hiking trails, wetlands boardwalk, a treehouse, playground, gardens, hammocks, swings and benches. On the same property is the Dunwoody Nature Center.






Size: 25 acres

The Nature Center puts on concerts throughout the spring and summer. Each year the Nature Center hosts a 'Summer Concert Series' on Saturdays in the Park.




The Dunwoody Nature Center features 22 acres and four distinct habitats that allow campers to explore nature as it was meant to be. By combining play and learning through different weekly themes, children are able to grow and develop at their own pace, connect with nature, and better understand their place in the natural world. Campers love to play in the teepee, dip their toes in Wildcat Creek, and test their skills in the forested playground. The Nature Center offers camps whenever school is out: summer, spring break, fall break, Thanksgiving and winter!



Experience nature, science and fun through age-appropriate games, crafts, stories, and other seasonal activities. Each class offers children the ability to learn and explore at their own pace; when real learning and growth comes from play in a guided environment that fosters a unique sense of accomplishment and self-awareness. Each week will feature a customized theme with creative learning activities and adventures developed to re-connect children to the natural world around them.



There are many opportunities to take advantage of the Nature Center's natural surroundings such as its popular 'Friday Night Hikes.' Explorers gather by the old fireplace in the meadow for a leisurely, family-oriented hike that follows the trails around the wetlands and forests. Educators guide groups through the hike, offering a chance to hear the nighttime sounds of owls, bats, and other nocturnal creatures as well as the gentle flow of Wildcat Creek.



The Nature Center offers families the opportunity to learn camping basics by camping out at the Nature Center, complete with a fire, s'mores, games, a night hike, and camp songs.

Walking Trails

The City of Dunwoody has miles and miles of trails that connect neighborhoods, parks and destinations. You can take a stroll, walk or bike to get to where you're going or just enjoy the outdoors!

Treetop Quest - Brook Run Park

The new elevated course and zip-line adventure showcases 52 obstacles and 12 zip-lines in 4 courses. In addition, the park includes a Net Trampoline, the first of its kind in Georgia, and a low ropes course for children ages 4 to 6, called Kiddie Quest. Dog Park - Brook Run Park

The Brook Run Dog Park is roughly two wooded acres for off-leash play. Nestled in the woods towards the back of Brook Run Park, the tree canopy offers shade protection from the summer heat as well as from mild rains. The Dog Park is entirely fenced and features multiple entry points with double-gates for safety of the dogs and their humans.

Bocce Courts - Georgetown Park

Georgetown Park Bocce Courts are regulation size courts. The courts are available on a first come first serve basis. Players will need to bring their own bocce balls.



The Park at Pernoshal Court has two half-courts and a full size basketball court perfect for fun and exercise. One of the half-courts has a Pickleball overlay which allows for Pickleball play, a paddle sport created for all ages and skill levels.

Tennis - Windwood Hollow Park

The two Windwood Hollow tennis courts are open to players of all experience levels. The courts are not lit and close at sundown.

Skate Park - Brook Run Park


Brook Run Skate Park is the largest skate park in the metro Atlanta area, consisting of a variety of skate terrain for all skill levels. The park was designed to accommodate entry-level skaters as well as challenge more advanced "street skaters" looking to test themselves on elements they might encounter throughout most public locations. The 27,000 sq. ft. facility is a "flow" type of park and is fully lighted. Helmets are required at the Skate Park so please come prepared. Download the Skate Park Rules.

The Skate Park is open year round, seven days a week from 7:00 a.m. – 9:00 p.m. (Sunday through Thursday) and 7:00 a.m. – 10:00 p.m. (Friday and Saturday).









Brook Run Park - (4770 North Peachtree Road, Dunwoody) Brook Run Park is the largest park in not only Dunwoody but the region and is home to one of Dunwoody's largest playgrounds. At Brook Run children can slide, swing, run, jump and play!



Georgetown Park - (4400 Dunwoody Park Drive, Dunwoody) Georgetown Park playground is perfect for children looking for a little outdoor fun! Complete with slides, swings, climbing bars, and more.



Windwood Hollow Park - (4865 Lakeside Drive, Dunwoody) The brand new Windwood Hollow playground is a place for the young and young at heart. It features equipment for children of all ages and is ADA accessible.



Dunwoody Park - (5343 Roberts Drive, Dunwoody) Tucked in the woods, on the eastside of Wildcat Creek, is the Dunwoody Park Playground. This hidden amenity is great for families that would like a little outdoor fun.

Dunwoody Senior Baseball



Applications

Facility Rental Applications, for the reservation of park facilities, must be received by the Parks and Recreation Division at least two weeks prior to the event date and not made more than six months out from the event date. Before you apply, check out the Facility Rental Calendar for availability.

Fees

Facility rental fees start at \$75. All fees for park and facility rentals are due upon approval of an application and the space is not considered officially reserved until all fees have been paid. Please visit the Park Registration Portal at https://secure.rec1.com/GA/dunwoody-ga/catalog for more information.

Caterers and Grills

You may have retail and food vendors at your event but copies of all participating vendor business licenses are required. Grills are NOT permitted on any grassy area or in any pavilion.

Alcohol

Alcohol is permitted with a \$200 refundable deposit. The deposit must be paid with facility rental fee. If the pavilion/event field is clean and free of damage after your event, the alcohol deposit will be refunded by check. Alcohol is NOT permitted in city parks except as part of a facility rental or special event where all appropriate permits and fees have been paid.

Music and Sound Systems

Sound amplification devices are permitted but must comply with the city's Noise Ordinance. A description of the equipment and devices must be submitted with your application.

Insurance - Bounce Houses

Private Rentals with inflatable bounce houses require proof of insurance.
