A Little History:

- Stage Door Players began in 1973 thanks to a few community leaders and the Dunwoody Woman's Club.
- Our first performance space was the second-floor of what is now the Citizen's Bank space in Dunwoody Village.
- In 1985, Dunwoody Elementary School was closed and in late 1987/1988 Stage Door Players moved into our current space in the DeKalb Cultural Arts Building, along with the Spruill Center for the Arts, and the Dunwoody Library.
- In 2002, Robert Egizio was hired as the Artistic Director he along with his team moved the Community theater to a Professional level of theater where we are today.



DID YOU KNOW.....

- □ Stage Door Players has approximately 1400 Season Subscribers
- □ Season Subscribers come from 72 different Zip Codes
- ☐ Stage Door Players is a 501©3 theater
- **□** Volunteers donated 4087 hours last year
- □Cost for a Non-Musical play is \$15,000-20,000 per play
- □Cost for a Musical is \$35,000-\$45,000 per play



What is the Financial Impact of Covid-19?

Our fiscal year runs from August 31 - September 1st

- ☐ In March of 2020, we were running on target to having a very good year.
 - As of March we were NET POSITIVE \$8,682
 - As of September 1st, we were at a NET LOSS of \$41,119
- ☐ Our Cash Position is Down by \$51,899 from 2019 due to the theater being closed.
- ☐ We want to say **THANK YOU** to the **City of Dunwoody** who has provided us with Reduced Rent for the balance of the year!
- ☐ Will we come out on the other side of Covid-19?
 - YES, WE WILL!



So What Does all of this Mean?

- ☐ Stage Door Players has been closed since March 17th
- ☐ We currently cannot see a way to open the theater until patrons and actors begin to feel more comfortable with the close proximity in our intimate 125 seat theater.
 - Approximately 70% of our patrons are over 65.
 - Based on the survey responses many won't be comfortable until we have a vaccine
 - If we keep people at six feet, thirty-five (35) people may be in the theater at a time. Two
 (2) in the restrooms and about seven (7) in our lobby.
- ☐ The Board of Directors has had to make some tough decisions:
 - We have had no programming since March. Theater opening maybe Spring of 2021.
 - All costs have been cut to the bare bone.
 - Effective August 1st, both the Artistic and Managing Directors' salaries were cut in half.
 - After no programming for six (6) months, effective September 1st, the Artistic Director was furloughed.
 - We don't see a return of any of our main stage programming for at least another six months.

Challenges & how to Manage?

☐ Limited Space.

- Limited Play opportunities
 - Current Play decisions are partially made on what is available to the audience size of your theater. We are a smaller venue therefore our selection of plays are limited.
- Adapt our programming to perhaps include other opportunities outside of our space.

☐ Software, Hardware, and Technology:

- For the Office:
 - We have updated our Website & its capabilities
 - We have implemented a program for our database management.
 - We need additional equipment and software for ticketing.
- For the Theater:
 - We recently discovered that the majority of the lighting and sound equipment that was used for productions was rented or borrowed.
 - We have decided this is an opportune time to assess and implement a system that will work internally and with some opportunities outside of our six (6) mainstage shows

- **Engage and Entertain** —draw the audience into the story, inspire them to consider a larger context, and ensure each production provides the opportunity to experience creative storytelling.
