The Mount Vernon Chapter of the Sons of the American Revolution, located in Dunwoody/Sandy Springs and was duly chartered on September 24, 2016. There are approximately 80 active members in the Chapter, which meets in Dunwoody on the second Tuesday of most months of the year.

Our national parent organization - The Sons of the American Revolution - is a non-political, patriotic, historical, and educational nonprofit 501(c)3 corporation open to anyone who is a male lineal descendant of the patriots that fought in or supported the American Revolution between the years 1774-1783. It is a Congressionally chartered society with more than 208,000 members admitted since its founding in 1889.

Formed by 28 Organizing Members, the Sandy Springs Chapter, NSDAR was confirmed by the National Board of Management on 03, February 2007.

A resident of Dunwoody, E. Lynn Brackey, Organizing Regent, presided over the Organizing Meeting which was held at the Cherokee Country Club in Sandy Springs, Georgia.

At the present time the Sandy Springs Chapter, NSDAR meets six times during the year at the Dunwoody Country Club. As of 2021 our membership has risen to 107 members who are "Expanding a legend of community service and preservation of our American Heritage as well as participate in Patriotism, Education and Historic Preservation activities throughout the year."
