

City Manager Monthly Report Report Ending August 5, 2022



POLICE

Upcoming Events (August 1, 2022 – October 31, 2022)

- The Dunwoody Police Department will be hosting National Night Out at Brook Run Park on Thursday, August 4, 2022, at the same time as Food Truck Thursdays. The department will have multiple police vehicles and staff on hand.
- The department will be conducting a Citizen Response to Active Shooter Event (CRASE) training class on Wednesday, August 3, 2022, at the N. Shallowford Annex.
- Pack a Patrol Car is in progress to collect school supplies for needy children. The campaign ends at the National Night Out event at Brook Run Park on August 4th.

Major Projects:

• The Dunwoody Police Department and DeKalb County School District Police Department came together to conduct an Active Shooter Tabletop Exercise.

Other Highlights:

- The Dunwoody Police Department hosted the Dunwoody Police Teen Police Academy the week of July 11th.
- The North Metro SWAT team was used to execute a search warrant at an apartment on Chamblee Dunwoody Road in reference to drug sales at that location, plus three overdose incidents had occurred. Officers made several arrests and various drugs were seized.
- The Crime Response Team conducted a Distracted Driving detail in the PCID area. Officers issued 20 citations and one arrest.
- Over time, the department has received multiple court orders to dispose of 66 firearms that were either found or recovered during police operations. By state law, these firearms must be disposed of through a sale or by sealed bids to a license federal firearm dealer. Multiple sealed bids were received with the highest bid of \$8,896 going to Dana Safety Supply.

Workload/Activities:

• Officers conducted a Traffic Stop and the vehicle fled from Officers, but later located in Chamblee and the driver was arrested.



- Officers responded to a report of a Child Locke in a Vehicle. DeKalb Fire and Dunwoody Police Officers attempted to unlock the doors but were unable to do so. Forced entry was then made to the vehicle and the child was removed in good health.
- Officers responded to a report of a Person Shot on Tilly Mill Road. An 18-yearold male shot himself in the head and was found by his family.
- Officers responded to a Person Hit by Auto call on Winters Chapel Road. An injured juvenile male was located and transported to the hospital. A couple of hours later, a male suspect turned himself into the Police admitting he struck the juvenile and left the scene.
- Officers responded to a report of an Aggravated Assault. The victim was conducting a child custody exchange when the child's father pointed a firearm at the victim when she was holding her child. Two female suspects also pushed the victim to the ground and began punching her.
- Officers responded to a report of Shots Fired around Dunwoody Glen Apartments. Officers located the suspects who admitted firing a gun in the air and were taken into custody.
- Officer Irwin and K9 Ranger responded to a request by Brookhaven Police Department to assist with tracking an offender who fled. The suspect was not located.
- Officers responded to a report of a Sexual Assault at the Sonesta Inn. The victim met the suspect on a dating app and traveled from Florida to meet the suspect. The victim was sexually assaulted. CID is investigating.
- Officers responded to a report of a Strong-Armed Robbery while walking down the street. A suspect grabbed a package from the victim and ran. The package contained an expensive Michael Kors purse. Officers were able to locate the suspect and arrest him.
- Officers conducted a Traffic Stop on vehicle and discovered the vehicle was recently stolen. The driver was arrested.
- Officers conducted a Traffic Stop and discovered the driver was a Wanted Person out of Sandy Springs. The suspect resisted arrest but was eventually taken into custody.
- Officers responded to a report of a Suspicious Person being a naked female knocking on someone's door. Officers made contact with the female who stated she had been raped. CID is investigating.

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- Officers responded to a report of an Attempted Burglary at an apartment on Chamblee Dunwoody Road. The suspects were located and charged with Loitering & Prowling.
- Officers responded to a report of an Attempted Burglary at the same apartment on Chamblee Dunwoody Road. The male and female suspect were located and arrested.
- Officers responded to a Structure Fire on Lake Ridge Lane. Officers evacuated the entire building. DeKalb Fire was able to contain the fire to one apartment.
- Officers received a License Plate Reader (LPR) hit on a Wanted Person. The vehicle was located, and the driver was arrested.
- Officers conducted a Traffic Stop on a vehicle. K9 Hank alerted on the vehicle and drugs were located inside the vehicle.
- Officers received a LPR hit on a Wanted Person. Officers were able to locate the vehicle and driver. The driver was not the wanted person but had a warrant on him for Identity Theft. He was arrested.
- Officers responded to a report of a Tree Down on Dunwoody Club at Ashley Trace. Public Works responded and removed the tree.
- Officers responded to a report of a Flooded Road on I-285 westbound between Chamblee Dunwoody Road and Ashford Dunwoody Road. The road construction crews responded and unblocked the drain.
- Officers responded to Macys on a report of Shoplifting. A male fled the scene from Officers but lost him in the parking deck. A female was taken into custody.
- Officers responded to a report of a Welfare Check on a female on I-285. The female was making outrageous statements and was eventually transported to the hospital for treatment.
- Officers responded to a Vehicle Crash into a house on Peeler Road. The homeowner observed the crash on her RING camera.
- Officers attempted to conduct a Traffic Stop on a suspected DUI driver. The driver fled from the scene and was stopped in Sandy Springs later and arrested.
- Officers attempted to conduct a Traffic Stop on a vehicle where the occupants are suspects in several Entering Autos in Dunwoody. The vehicle fled from Officers.
- Officers received a LPR hit on a Wanted Person. The suspect vehicle was located, and the driver was arrested.
- Officers responded to a report of an Entering Auto in Progress on Hammond Drive. A witness observed the suspect pulling on door handles of vehicles in the parking lot. The suspect pulled on the door handle of the victim's vehicle while

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he was in it and then fled the scene when he realized someone was in the vehicle. Officers were able to locate and arrest the suspect.

- Officers responded to a report of multiple Entering Autos around Vermack Ridge, Parliament Way, and Chateau Drive.
- Officers responded to a report of a Stolen Auto on Kellogg Circle. The vehicle was possibly used in the multiple Entering Autos previously reported.
- Officers responded to a report of an Entering Auto at Brook Run Park where 2 vehicles were broken into.
- Officers received a LPR hit on a Stolen Auto. The vehicle was located, and the driver was arrested.
- Officers responded to a report of Vandalism at Brook Run Park. The garage doors at the skate park were spray painted with graffiti.
- Officers responded to a report of an Entering Auto at Lazy Dog. The victim walked outside, and the suspect was attempting to break in the victim's car. The victim held the suspect at gunpoint until the Police arrived. The suspect filmed himself breaking into the car.
- Officers received a LPR hit on a Wanted Person. The vehicle was located, and the suspect was arrested.
- Officers responded to a report of Identify Fraud. A female suspect was attempting to withdraw \$8,500 from an account that was not hers. The suspect was arrested.
- Officers attempted to conduct a Traffic Stop on a Dodge Charger. The vehicle fled from Officers.
- Officers received a LPR hit on a Wanted Person. The vehicle was located, and the suspect was arrested.
- Officers responded to a report of an Armed Robbery on Fergus Way. A young black male suspect robbed the victim at gunpoint and took his watch.

- Officers responded to a report of a subject violating a No Contact Bond Condition. The suspect had multiple warrants and fled from Officers. During the foot chase and arrest, two Officers sustained minor injuries.
- Officers responded to a report of a Theft. A subject was adding a cellphone to his girlfriend's account when he suddenly fled with the phone. Officers were able to identify the suspect and secure an arrest warrant.

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- Officers responded to a report of Shots Fired in Notting Hill Apartments. Officers located shell casings from two different firearms, but no damage was observed and no suspects.
- Officers responded to a report of multiple Stolen Autos on Peachtree Place Parkway. Two vehicles were stolen by unknown subjects.
- Officers responded to a report of a Theft by Snatching on Ashford Dunwoody Road. A black male subject tried on a \$13,000 necklace and then fled the scene with it.

- Officers responded to a report of a Lost Person at Crowne Plaza. Officers located an elderly couple that was confused and thought they were in Kennesaw. Family members were contacted and were able to take care of the couple.
- Officers responded to a report of a Theft. The victim parked his convertible at Publix and when he returned, he noticed his handicap placard was missing.
- Officers responded to a Person Dead call possibly from an overdose. CID is investigating.
- Officers responded to a report of a Theft in Progress. A witness observed two males removing tires from a vehicle. Officers were able to locate and arrest one suspect while he was rolling a tire down the street.
- Officers responded to a report of a Traffic Hazard on I-285 westbound at North Peachtree Road. A tractor trailer broke in half and stopped in the roadway blocking several lanes.
- Officers received a LPR hit on a Stolen Tag. Officers located the vehicle and arrested the driver. A stolen firearm was located as well as drugs and drug paraphernalia. The driver and passenger were also charged with providing a false name.

Major Projects:

- Spalding at Chamblee Dunwoody Intersection- Construction 57 is completing remaining punch list items.
- Spalding Storm Drain Upgrade Astra Contracting will begin tree clearing for the bore pit in early August.
- Georgetown Gateway The city's contractor completed 390 feet of stormwater pipe. Georgia Power began relocating poles south of Old Spring House Lane and is expected to complete

the work in August. AT&T resumed relocation of their overhead lines north of Old Spring House Lane and is expected to finish this phase in August. Minor traffic delays will continue on Chamblee Dunwoody Road between 9 a.m. and 4 p.m.

- Winters Chapel Trail, Phase I The contractor is working between Fontainebleau Way and Dunwoody Club Drive. The work is delayed south of Fontainebleau Way until AT&T completes their relocation which is now expected to be in August. Minor traffic delays will occur on Winters Chapel Road on weekdays between 9 a.m. and 4 p.m.
- Chamblee Dunwoody at Womack Intersection- Wilson Construction began work on the retaining wall adjacent to the library. Atlanta Gas Light's contractor completed the gas main relocation. Zayo completed the fiber optic cable relocation and Crown Castle is expected to finish theirs in August. Delays will occur at the intersection on weekdays between 9 a.m. and 4 p.m.

Other Highlights:

- A Request for Qualifications (RFQ) was advertised for Jett Ferry Streetscape plan and Chamblee Dunwoody-Peeler to Vermack Corridor design.
- The land survey has begun for the Mount Vernon Road Corridor project between Corners Drive and Mount Vernon Place.

- The Partner Events and Programs have been received for Fall/Winter '22 L.E.A.F. The online guide will highlight programs and events throughout the Dunwoody parks system for September – December.
- The grills have been replaced and overall improvements made to grilling areas at Pernoshal Park.
- The Groundbreaking at 50 Perimeter Center East was on July 25th. The five-acre park will feature the City's first splash pad, a playground, small and large pavilions, restroom facilities, exercise equipment, and trails. The park is scheduled for completion by the end of 2022.

Other Highlights:

- The staff received quotes for additional parking lot lights, renovation of existing lights and exterior lighting upgrades to LED fixtures at the Dunwoody Cultural Arts Center.
- The Grounded Growth ribbon cutting was held on July 7th. The piece serves as both art and as a functional bike rack.
- The Holiday Lights Request for Quote ended on July 29th. The selected vendor will come to Council at a future meeting for contract approval.

Workload/Activities:

- The Athletic Association Usage Agreement renewal reviews are going into 2023.
- The Operations Grounds Coordinator position has been filled. David Alexander will join the department August 8th.



• July Groovin' on the Green concert has been rescheduled for August 19th due to rain.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

Recent and Upcoming Cases: (July 2022 – August 2022)

- July 7th: The Zoning Board of Appeals (ZBA) reviewed 5 residential variance cases with four being approved and one deferred to the August meeting.
- August 4th: The ZBA will review 2 residential variance cases.
- August 8th: Mayor and City Council will review a resolution in support of the DeKalb County Service Delivery Strategy and a text amendment to create material standards for residential driveways.
- August 9th: The Planning Commission will review two cases: a previously deferred Special Land Use Permit and a Rezoning/Special Land Use Permit for a mixed-use development on Perimeter Center Parkway.

Major Projects:

- The High Street development is continuing its buildout, with the mixed use/residential buildings reaching three and four stories respectively.
- The permitting continues for the Campus 244 project, which includes the rehabilitation of an office building, and the construction of a hotel and a parking deck.
- The path and sidewalk are nearing completion at Perimeter Marketplace on Ashford Dunwoody Road. The trees and plants have been planted.

Workload/Activities:

- The department completed 605 building inspections.
- The staff issued 33 Code Enforcement warnings and 12 citations.
- The staff conducted 139 Code Enforcement inspections, including 12 vacant properties.
- The staff issued 3 stop work orders.
- The Code Compliance division issued 8 Citations to local businesses for failure to obtain a city alcohol permit. The Division also conducted the monthly multi-family property maintenance sweep at Dunwoody Gables, located at 1970 Peachford Rd, Dunwoody, GA 30338.
- The staff completed 67 site inspections and issued 3 stop work orders.



- The Buffalo Wild Wings site is causing issues for downstream neighbors. The staff met with them about corrections, but the corrections were implemented were not enough. A citation was issued on July 22nd.
- The staff received 118 permit applications.
- A total of 112 permits were issued during this period.
- The second household hazardous waste event will be held on September 10th from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. at City Hall.


