POLICE

Upcoming Events (May 1, 2022 – August 31, 2022)

- Flock License Plate Reader (LPR) and Cameras will be added to the old Austin Elementary site soon.

Other Highlights:

- One of the I-285 EB collector distributor lanes from GA 400 flooded causing a traffic hazard.
- Officers conducted, in partnership with the Governor's Office of Highway Safety and the DeKalb Police Department STAR team, a Distracted Driving Detail on Ashford Dunwoody Road. A total of 62 citations were issued, including 50 for hands free violations.

Workload/Activities:

- Officers responded to a report of Shots Fired around 31 Perimeter Center East. No suspect or victim was located.
- Officers responded to Park Place to a report of a Criminal Trespass where Officers located a male sleeping. Officers ask the male to leave, which he refused and after he was asked multiple times, Officers attempted to place him under arrest. The subject resisted and was ultimately sprayed with pepper spray and arrested.
- Officers responded to a License Plate Reader (LPR) hit of a Stolen Auto. The vehicle fled from Brookhaven Police and was located abandoned in Chamblee. K9 Hank was able to track and locate the driver of the vehicle and all three occupants were located.
- Officers responded to a Burglary at Perimeter Mall. An unknown suspect entered seven kiosks and took numerous items.
- Officers attempted to conduct a Traffic Stop on a vehicle. The driver fled Officers, almost striking a pedestrian.
- Officers responded to a report of a Burglary. The victim had observed 3 Hispanic males breaking into her apartment. The suspects stole \$3,200 in cash.
- Officers responded to a report of a Disorderly Person at Gilly's Sports Bar. Officers were able to convince the female subject to leave. Once outside with her husband, they began to argue and had to be separated. While Officers were dealing with the husband, the female jumped in her car and left the scene. Officers were able to locate the vehicle and arrest the driver after she resisted arrest.
- Officers responded to an Armed Robbery incident in Sandy Springs. K-9 Ranger was able to track two-Armed Robbery suspects that had crashed in Sandy

Springs after a chase with the Roswell Police Department. Ranger located two of the four suspects along with multiple guns, cash, and drugs.

- Officers responded to a Welfare Check of a person passed out in the Chick-fil-A line on Jett Ferry. The male victim was showing signs of an opioid overdose. Officers administered four doses of Narcan before EMS arrived. The male finally began breathing normal and refused transport to a hospital.
- Officers conducted a Traffic Stop and found a male subject was wanted on an outstanding warrant and had drugs and an illegal firearm in his vehicle.
- Officers conducted a Traffic Stop and K9 Ranger positively alerted on the vehicle. Two bags of marijuana were located.
- Officers responded to a report of Theft of Mail. Two subjects were observed on video stealing mail from apartment mailboxes.
- Officers conducted a Traffic Stop and found the driver with an injured hand. The driver stated he punched his radio because he knew he was going to jail as he had smoked marijuana and had more in the car. A search revealed meth, cocaine, and a large amount of marijuana.
- Officers received a (License Plate Reader) LPR hit on a Wanted Person. The subject was located and arrested on outstanding warrants for Burglary and Robbery.
- Officers responded to a Terroristic Threats call. An ex-boyfriend was at the location making threats to harm his ex-girlfriend with a gun and was streaming live on Instagram. The suspect fled before Officers arrived and was located in Pernoshal Park and was arrested.

- Officers responded to a report of an Aggravated Assault. A customer left a restaurant after closing and when he tried to reenter the door was locked. When he was finally able to enter, he brandished a gun and pointed it at employees. The suspect left prior to Officers arrival.
- Officers received a License Plate Reader (LPR) hit on a Wanted Person. The vehicle was located, and the driver was arrested.
- Officers responded to a report of a Person Armed call. Three subjects were in a vehicle with handguns in their lap. No crime had occurred, so they were released.

- Officers responded to a report of Domestic Violence. Officers located a victim who had been choked by her boyfriend and held against her will. The suspect was arrested for Aggravated Assault Strangulation and False Imprisonment.

- Officers responded to a report of a Stolen Auto. Unknown suspects broke into a car in the driveway of the victim and used the garage door opener to open the garage and take a vehicle that was parked inside.

- Officers responded to a report of an Overdose at the Lazy Dog. A 21-year-old female, who came earlier today to interview for a job, was found in the restroom deceased. Officers delivered two doses of Narcan and deployed an AED. The victim was pregnant and had previously overdosed.
- Officers responded to a report of a Bank Robbery at the Chase bank on Ashford Dunwoody Road. The suspect provided a note, left the bank on foot with an undisclosed amount of cash, and ran toward Perimeter Mall. The suspect is a black male wearing a mask.
- Officers responded to a Road Rage incident which happened on I-285 eastbound near Chamblee Dunwoody Road. The victim almost struck a vehicle when trying to exit onto Ashford Dunwoody Road. The victim heard a pop, and his back windshield was damaged.
- Officers received a License Plate Reader (LPR) hit on a Wanted Person for Aggravated Assault. Officers were able to locate the vehicle and arrest the suspect.
- Officers responded to a report of an Auto Theft in Progress. The victim was notified that his vehicle had moved. When he went outside, he saw his vehicle in the parking lot next to another similar vehicle. As he approached, the suspects fled in his vehicle along with another vehicle. As the victim and his girlfriend followed the vehicle, two suspects shot multiple times at them from the second vehicle. One of the bullets grazed the leg of the victim's girlfriend.
- Officers responded to a report of a Suicide. A 26-year-old female shot and killed herself. The victim left a note.
- Officers responded to a report of a Person Injured. Officers located a 22-year-old female that had either fallen or jumped from the balcony of an apartment on the 4th floor. The victim was transported to the hospital with a possible broken shoulder.

- Officers responded to a report of Street Racing around Savoy Drive and N. Shallowford. As Officers arrived, the vehicles left the area.
- Officers responded to a report of Person Collapsed. Officers responded quickly and deployed their AED. The AED delivered a shock, but unfortunately, the victim died.
- Officers were at the QT on Peachtree Industrial Boulevard and heard gunshots. They observed three suspects who fled on foot. One suspect was observed running with a gun in his hand and refused commands. The suspect was Tased and taken into custody.
- Officers responded to a report of a Domestic Dispute. The victim was punched in the face knocking her in the bushes. The suspect was located and taken into custody. The suspect was in possession of a fraudulent check for \$58,000.
- Officers responded to a report of Identity Theft that occurred at the Marriott. Officers located the suspect, and he was taken into custody. The suspect is a convicted felon and was in possession of a handgun.
- Officers responded to La-Z-Boy in reference to a Disorderly Person. The suspect was drinking Champaign from a bottle and pouring it on multiple pieces of furniture.
- Officers responded to a report of a Suspicious Person around Wickenby Way. As the victim exited her vehicle, a male subject approached her. As she shouted at him, he walked away and began looking in vehicles. The suspect was located and arrested.
- Officers responded to Petland to a report of a Puppy Theft. Two black male suspects were looking at a French Bulldog, valued at \$10,000, and left the store with the puppy driving a silver Tesla with no tag.

- Officers responded to an Explosion at a residence on Village Court. An unexplained explosion happened in the basement of the home. Two people were slightly injured, and DeKalb Fire is investigating.
- Officers responded to a report of a Wanted Person. The vehicle was located, and the suspect was arrested.
- Officers responded to Multiple Fights on Friday night at Lemonade Days. The fights were broken up and the juveniles left the park.

Dunwoody Apartments on Ashford Dunwoody Road. Officers were able to locate a suspect and arrest him. The vehicle was stolen out of Ohio.

As the victim was attempting to leave the property, she was approached by several Hispanic males in a Honda who pulled her door open and displayed a knife demanding money.

Major Projects:

- Spalding at Chamblee Dunwoody Intersection- Construction 57 should complete their work in May. The remaining tasks include final paving and switching over to the new traffic signal. The pipe under Spalding Drive at the city limit will be upgraded by another contractor over the summer.
- Georgetown Gateway- The city's contractor has completed 1,000 feet of curb at the north end of the project. Atlanta Gas Light's contractor completed the new gas main. Georgia Power is planning to return in May to relocate the overhead lines south of Old Spring House Lane. AT&T is behind schedule on relocating their overhead lines and has been waiting on the gas main to be finished before

starting to move underground lines. The new water main has been installed and the final switch over of customers to the new main is expected to be completed in May. Minor traffic delays will continue on Chamblee Dunwoody Road between 9 a.m. and 4 p.m.

- Winters Chapel Trail, Phase I- Comcast will complete their relocation of overhead lines in May. The city’s contractor completed 350 feet of curb, a retaining wall and the pavement leveling in April. Minor traffic delays will occur on Winters Chapel Road on weekdays between 9 a.m. and 4 p.m.
- Chamblee Dunwoody at Womack Intersection- Awaiting start date from Atlanta Gas Light for gas main relocation on Chamblee Dunwoody Road. The city’s contractor plans to begin site clearing in May. Minor delays will occur at the intersection on weekdays between 9 a.m. and 3 p.m.

- There were multiple carpentry and facility repairs completed at Dunwoody Nature Center in preparation for Monarchs & Margaritas & Memories event.
- A survey and limits of disturbance was completed at the Park at Perimeter Center East. The construction to commence the first of June once clearing and erosion control measures are installed.
