Designed for crosswalk intersections with heavy traffic, Pedestrian Hybrid Beacons (also known as HAWK beacons) will be installed at Chesnut Elementary School and at Perimeter Center West.

Unlike a traffic signal, the PHB rests in dark until a pedestrian activates it via pushbutton or other form of detection. When activated, the beacon displays a sequence of flashing and solid lights that indicate the pedestrian walk interval and when it is safe for drivers to proceed. A solid red light requires drivers to stop while pedestrians have the right-of-way to cross the street. The overhead beacon flashes red when the pedestrian signals display a flashing DON'T WALK indication. Drivers may proceed if the crosswalk is clear.

Projects Started This Quarter

Shade structures for Two Bridges Park approved and into manufacturing March 19. Structures will provide shade over the splash pad and playground areas and are scheduled to be installed in the Summer of 2024.
Quotes are being solicited for improvements at Waterford Park. Improvements include a 4,000-square-foot playground and resurfacing of the tennis courts. Playground Request for Proposals will close at the end of April, for contract award in the Summer of 2024.

- Summer programming and event components being secured for the next edition of L.E.A.F. Parks & Rec Guide. Summer issue features new programs like Dwarf Goat Pilates and Meditation, free Equalizer Health Classes, revamped Dunwoody Food Truck Thursday season, and more. Summer programming begins May 1.

 Concessionaire will assist in security of the skate park, plus offer programming and camps for both skaters and non-skaters alike.
- Expansion of the Spruill Arts Center was completed and unveiled to the public, March 23. The new space features seven new art studios, two additional ceramics studios, two multi-functional art rooms, glass studio, new blacksmithing studio, wood turning studio, a community room, and courtyard.

Projects Started This Quarter

- Construction has started on the Real Time Crime Center (RTCC) in the Roll Call Room.
- Citizen's Police Academy has started another class.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

Projects Started This Quarter

• The department has selected a preferred consultant for the creation of the 10year update to the Comprehensive Plan and the creation of a Unified Development Ordinance.

Ongoing Projects This Quarter

- The Planning & Zoning Division is processing a zoning application for the remaining lot at Park Center. Developer KDC is proposing a mixed-use development consisting of up to 300 dwelling units, 300,000 sf of office space, 175 hotel rooms, and 22,000 sf of retail space. The Planning Commission has recommended approval, and the City Council will hear the case at the April 8 meeting.
- Work is continuing on the new online system for permits, planning cases, code cases, and business licenses. The estimated completion is in late 2024.
- The Marcus Jewish Community Center is continuing construction on its campus-wide renovation project.
- The first residents have moved into High Street after the first apartment building received a Certificate of Occupancy. The second apartment building will likely be occupied in Q2, while construction is continuing for the remaining commercial buildings.
- Construction is progressing at the Campus 244 development with the first Certificates of Occupancy anticipated for Q2.


Finished Projects This Quarter


The City's New Chief of Police Mike Carlson commenced duties April 12

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

Highlights

- High Street is continuing its close-out process. Certificate of Occupancy for the commercial buildings expected. At that time, the central green and the grand staircase will become accessible to the public.
- City Council approved the rezoning for the last phase of the Park Center development on May 13. The development consists of two towers with up to 300,000 sf of office space, 300 apartment units, 175 hotel rooms, and 22,000 sf of retail space.
- Campus 244 has received a temporary Certificate of Occupancy for the parking deck and the office building. Move-in work for Transportation Insight is expected shortly.
- The City has signed the contract for the new Comprehensive Plan and Unified Development Ordinance. Kick-off for the project was in June.
- Communications campaign to educate homeowners of restrictions for construction and tree removel within the city's and state's steam bank buffers.

Accolades

 The 2024 household hazardous waste recycling event was successfully completed on May 4. With 473 residents participating, this was the largest household hazardous waste recycling event since the beginning of the pandemic.

- Payroc, the new payment vendor for the iWorQ permitting software was on boarded, which will allow credit card and ACH payments.
- City Council adopted new rules for community residences and recovery communities.
- New permitting fees for projects valued under \$75,000 was adopted in compliance with state laws.
- High Street opened to the public and all buildings received their Certificate of Occupancy. Opened stores include Nando's, Velvet Taco, and Ben & Jerry's.
- City Council adopted a text amendment for streetscapes for the Jett Ferry area.
