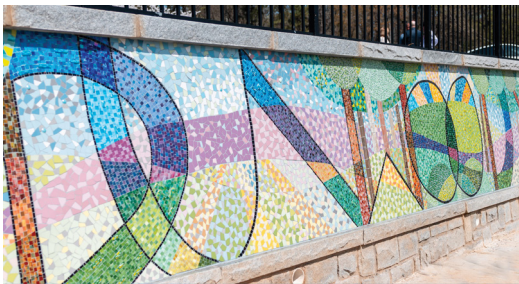

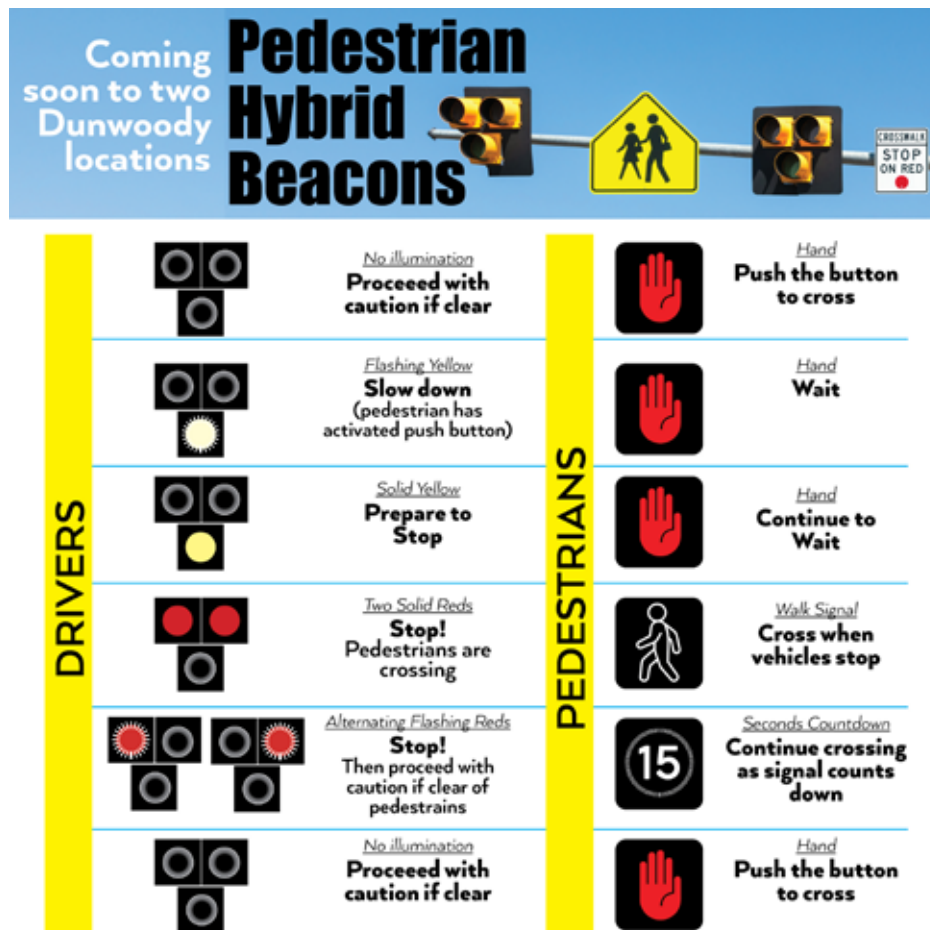

Designed for crosswalk intersections with heavy traffic, Pedestrian Hybrid Beacons (also known as HAWK beacons) will be installed at Chesnut Elementary School and at Perimeter Center West.

Unlike a traffic signal, the PHB rests in dark until a pedestrian activates it via pushbutton or other form of detection. When activated, the beacon displays a sequence of flashing and solid lights that indicate the pedestrian walk interval and when it is safe for drivers to proceed. A solid red light requires drivers to stop while pedestrians have the right-of-way to cross the street. The overhead beacon flashes red when the pedestrian signals display a flashing DON'T WALK indication. Drivers may proceed if the crosswalk is clear.

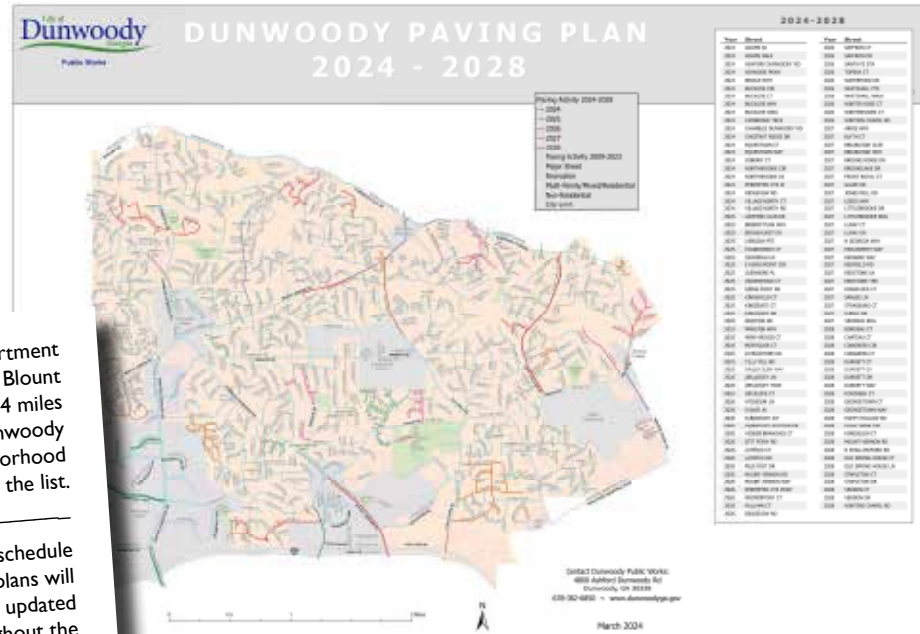

## Projects Started This Quarter

- Shade structures for Two Bridges Park approved and into manufacturing March 19. Structures will provide shade over the splash pad and playground areas and are scheduled to be installed in the Summer of 2024.
- Quotes are being solicited for improvements at Waterford Park. Improvements include a 4,000-square-foot playground and resurfacing of the tennis courts. Playground Request for Proposals will close at the end of April, for contract award in the Summer of 2024.

## Ongoing Projects This Quarter

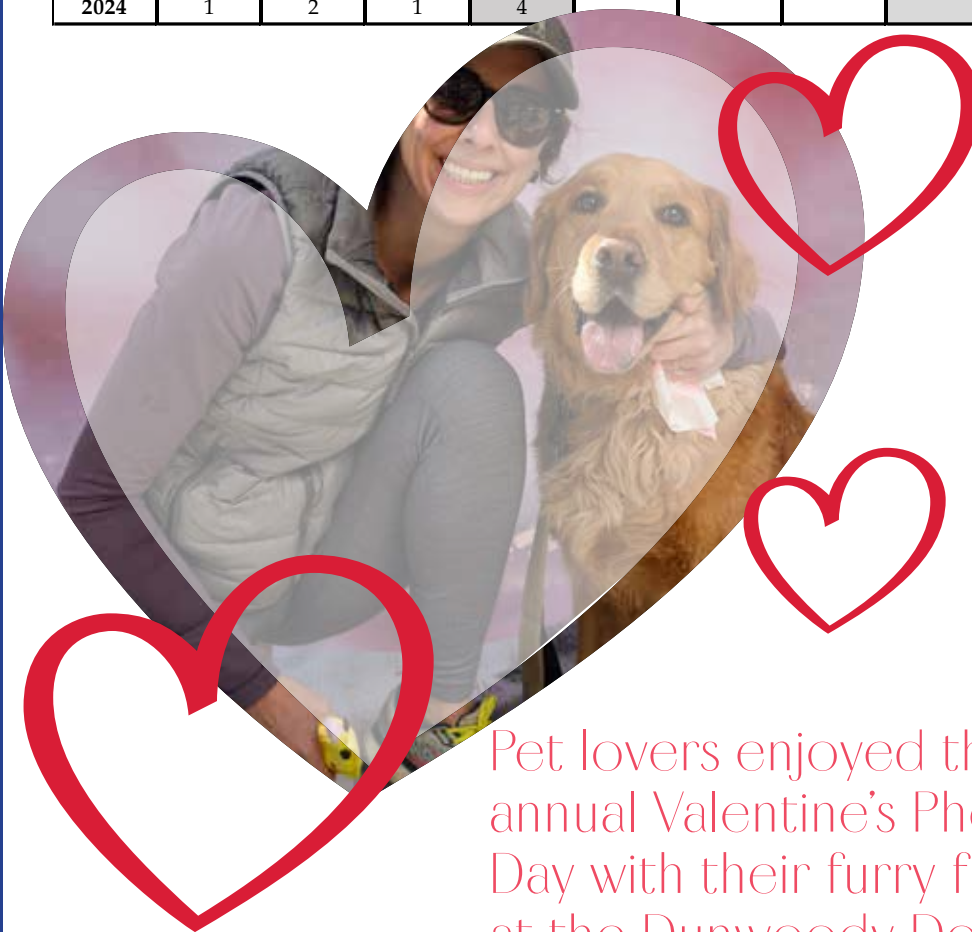

## Finished Projects This Quarter

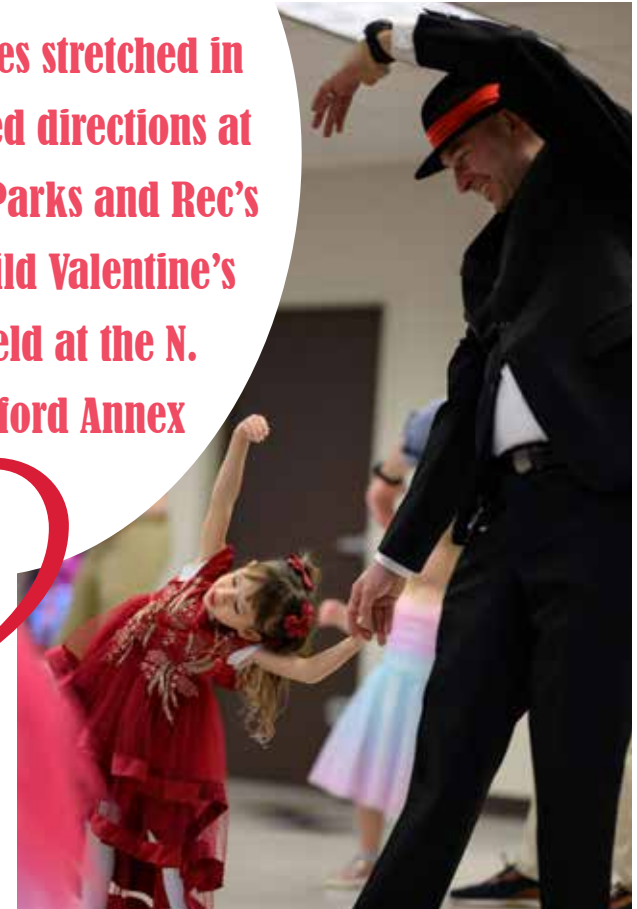

- Staff began training on the Defensive Tactics Training Program as a standard for all Officers. The program will include specialized training equipment and apparel to maximize learning.
- Applied for Senator Ossoff's FY2025 CDS.
- The department was able to open the second Property and Evidence position to focus on open records and assisting with the RTCC.
- Staff began working on the Strategic Planning Worksheets for the BerryDunn efficiency study.

- Officers participated in the ribbon cutting for the new Spruill Center being opened.
- The staff presented at the City Council retreat in north Georgia.
- Officers participated in the Special Olympics Torch run to raise awareness.
- Officers participated in career day at Chesnut Elementary School.
- Several Officers participated in a homeless outreach event to assist those in need.
- Received a new mental health coordinator from the DeKalb Community Services Board.
- Completed a state mock assessment for our certification later this year.
- The department conducted two Civilian Response to Active Shooter Events (CRASE) classes to approximately 80 attendees.
- Officers were issued active shooter vests and armor plates to provide ballistic protection.
- All patrol supervisors have received their new ballistic shields.
- Replaced soft body armor for approximately 50% of the department due to expiration.

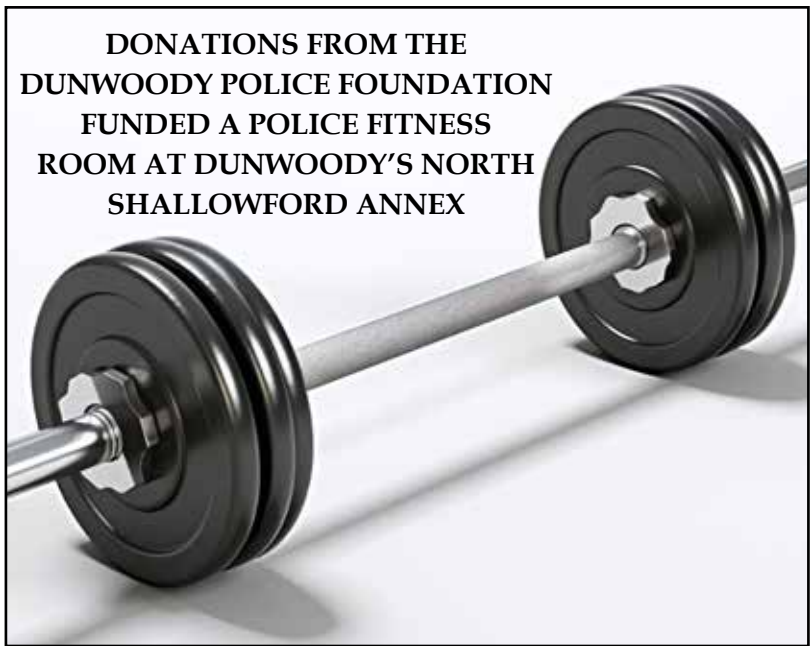

## Projects Started This Quarter

- The department has selected a preferred consultant for the creation of the 10-year update to the Comprehensive Plan and the creation of a Unified Development Ordinance.

## Ongoing Projects This Quarter

- The Planning & Zoning Division is processing a zoning application for the remaining lot at Park Center. Developer KDC is proposing a mixed-use development consisting of up to 300 dwelling units, 300,000 sf of office space, 175 hotel rooms, and 22,000 sf of retail space. The Planning Commission has recommended approval, and the City Council will hear the case at the April 8 meeting.
- Work is continuing on the new online system for permits, planning cases, code cases, and business licenses. The estimated completion is in late 2024.
- The Marcus Jewish Community Center is continuing construction on its campus-wide renovation project.
- The first residents have moved into High Street after the first apartment building received a Certificate of Occupancy. The second apartment building will likely be occupied in Q2, while construction is continuing for the remaining commercial buildings.
- Construction is progressing at the Campus 244 development with the first Certificates of Occupancy anticipated for Q2.

## Finished Projects This Quarter

- The Atlanta Regional Commission has recertified Dunwoody as Gold in the Green Communities program.
- The second iteration of the Front Yard Tree Program has successfully distributed all trees.
- The City Council adopted a text amendment allowing inflatables in single-dwelling residential districts.
- Politan Row has completed construction and successfully opened in the Ashford Lane development.

## Highlights

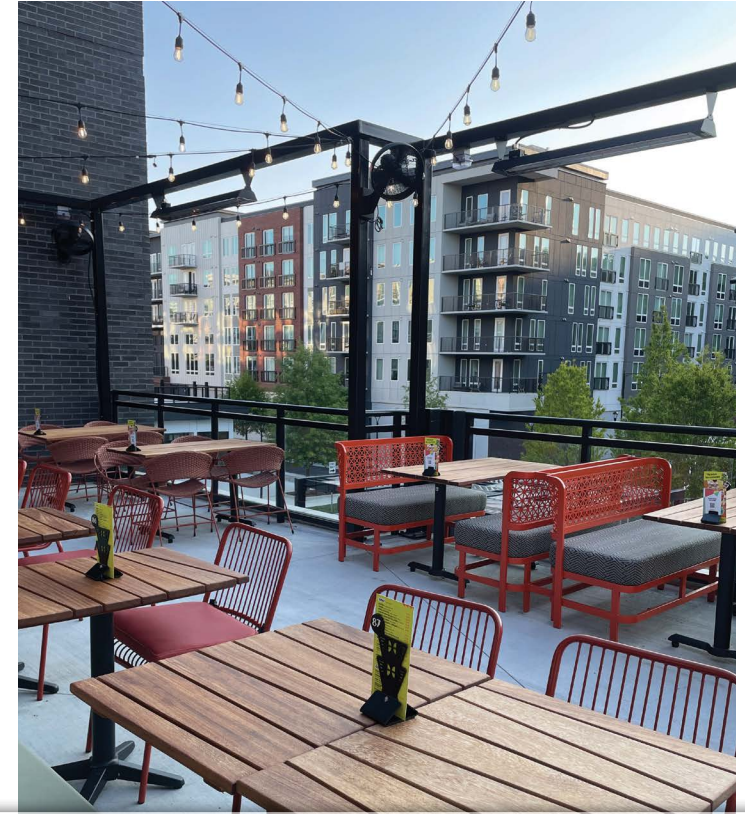


## Highlights
